This timber framed fibro clad house is set above the street level with access via a set of concrete steps. Below the first floor an undercroft houses a garage. The corrugated iron gambrel roof is punctuated to the rear (east) by a brick chimney. To the front elevation a separate gable with corrugated iron infill to the gable end is surrounded by a hipped corrugated iron verandah roof. There is a simple criss cross balustrade between timber verandah posts.

Although considerably altered and added to, the house still retains its original roof form, surrounding verandahs and corbelled chimney. The place has some historic significance being a relocated building and for its use as a maternity hospital.
