This timber framed fibro clad house has a hipped corrugated iron roof with a separate hipped verandah roof to the front (west) and north sides. The verandah is supported on timber posts with a timber frieze and criss-cross balustrade. The verandah to the north is enclosed. Windows are timber framed and casement style. Entry to the front verandah is via five concrete steps with a low rendered masonry balustrade to each side.
