This small timber framed cottage has a gable roof with broken back extensions to the rear and front. A separate lean-to roof to the front covers a verandah which is supported on metal posts. The gable ends have fibro cladding with weatherboard below, while a lean-to beyond is clad with fibro. The front section, (possibly a verandah originally) has fibro enclosures with aluminium windows. There is a large double garage adjoining the east facade. (Included as an example of the original houses in Wonthella.)
