Set high above street level, this small timber framed cottage has a hipped corrugated iron roof with a lean-to roof to the rear and a separate roof to the front verandah. The verandah is supported on chamfered timber posts with a timber balustrade which has detailing to fretwork panels. The ends and understorey of the verandah are enclosed with timber battens with a balustraded stairway leading up to the verandah from the front path. The house has weatherboard cladding to the front and corrugated iron to the sides. The central front entry door has timber framed double hung windows to each side. The front boundary of the property has a low masonry wall.
