This stone house has a steeply pitched hipped corrugated iron roof. The separate hipped verandah runs along three sides and is supported on timber posts. The front (west) facade is symmetrical with a window either side of a central doorway. Windows are timber framed and double hung. A stone extension to the east side of the house was completed in 1996. There is a large Moreton Bay Fig tree situated immediately to the south of the house.

Thomas Carroll took up the title to VL 898 in 1880 and advertised the property for sale in 1883. A line of flood gums west of the house were planted in 1888 to mark the high water mark of the 1888 flood. By 1914 the cottage was owned by James Rumble.
