2004/05 Review: Located to the west of Crowther Road, approximately 1.5 kilometres south of Phillips Road, this small stone cottage has a corrugated iron hipped roof with a lean-to at the rear. The cottage had a verandah to the front (east) elevation. The front façade is not symmetrical and features rendering around the openings. Note the palm trees to the rear.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The ruin of Delower's Cottage has local historic significance for its connection with early rural activities of the Front Flats. Further, the place is representative of the small and simple stone buildings which were characteristic of the local farming properties before the turn of the century.
