Former railway ganger, David Mitchell built the store in 1920. At that time the store was a small room on the right front section of his home. In the 1920s Moonyoonooka became the centre of the tomato growing industry. David Mitchell died in 1926, and the store was then operated by Mrs Hall. In 1932 the store was taken over by Mr F.E. Keep, and during the 1939-45 war was very popular with the hundreds of troops camped in the vicinity. Mr J. Reynolds took over from 1945 to 1952. The store was then owned by Messrs L. Millar and E. Fowler for ten years. In 1962 Ivor Davies purchased the property and in 1968 he rebuilt the store. By the mid 1990s the store was owned by Jim and Helen Frazer.
