Located to the east of the track that runs along the railway line, these stone ruins are set in an elevated position on a stony hill. Evidence remains of the rendered ashlar walls and remnants of a substantial walled garden to the rear. There is a brick chimney to the north-east of the cottage ruins. The remaining built fabric reveals that the cottage had a gable roof and a lean-to to the rear.

2004/05 Review: There are stone ruins of an outbuilding located to the south west of the cottage near the property boundary. Note - access is via the railway road.

The ruin of Wilton Cottage has only some historic significance for its association with the settlement of the Greenough Flats in the 1870s. The cottage is representative of farm buildings in the area, given its small scale, simple style and use of local stone.
