

ORV RULES

- All vehicles must have Off Road Vehicle Registration (unless road registered).
- Seatbelts must be worn.
- ORV's must stay within the boundaries of the gazetted/permitted Off Road Vehicle Area.
- Adhere to all regulation signs.
- Be mindful of the vegetation. Aim to cause nil destruction.
- Drive/ride slowly, the preferred speed is under 40kms and walking pace when people are nearby.
- You must carry your vehicle registration certificate with you.
- Helmets are mandatory.
- Your bike or quad must have an effective silencer – noise limits apply.
- Unless your vehicle is A Class road registered and you have a rider's licence, you must transport your ORV to your riding location on a trailer, van or utility.
Rangers and Police have the authority to confiscate ORV's in circumstances where they believe the vehicle is involved in an offence or if you are unable to prove ownership.





This brochure is a guide to off road vehicle (ORV) users, designed to help tourists and locals get the most out of their ORV experiences within the City of Greater Geraldton.

Apart from making sure you're riding in the correct locations, where you can ride depends on two things – the type of registration and a valid driver's/motorcycles licence.

Permitted access signs are located throughout the area.

SO WHERE CAN I RIDE?

	<p>Private Property - If you have owner's permission you can ride an unregistered vehicle on private property. There are no age restrictions and you don't need a drivers' licence (noise and dust offences may apply). <i>No registration or drivers licence required.</i></p>
	<p>Public Roads and Trails - To ride on any road or trail that is open to the public your vehicle must be fully road registered and you must have a valid drivers' licence. <i>Drivers licence and Class A registration required.</i></p>
	<p>Club Circuits - Motocross circuits operated by clubs are legally treated as private property, however the club may impose restrictions or regulations for safety or commercial reasons. The Geraldton Junior and Senior Motocross Club is located at Lot 2268, Landfill Lane, Narngulu WA 6532. Phone: 0481 186 590 <i>No registration or drivers licence required.</i></p>
	<p>Gazetted/Permitted Off Road Vehicle Areas - There are numerous locations in Geraldton. Refer to the following maps. Registration required. ORV permitted within red boundaries. Refer to maps.</p>
	<p>Other areas - It is against the law to ride a motor vehicle in any area not listed above.</p>
