2. Principles of Establishing International Relationships

The following principles should apply to International relationships:

- The proposed Candidate City must be in a country with which the Federal Government of Australia and/or Government of Western Australia has some form of positive relationship;
- The City of Greater Geraldton may add a maximum of one Sister City each year, with a maximum of six ongoing Sister City relationships, one per Nation, at any one time;
- Geographic concentration of Sister Cities in one global region should be avoided;
- In addition to formal Sister Cities, the City may establish Strategic Partnership relations with cities in other nations, as determined by Council.
- Following analysis, proposals for establishing new Sister City or Strategic Partnership
 relations must be submitted to Council's Sister City Economic & Cultural Development
 Advisory Committee for endorsement prior to being submitted to Council for
 deliberation and prior to any action final approval; and

Establishing International relationships should take into account cultural, ethical and/or moral issues pertinent to the community at the time.

Principles of Establishing International Relationships

The following principles should apply to International relationships:

- The City of Greater Geraldton may have one Sister City per country and a maximum of 6 Sister city relationships at any one time;
- The City of Greater Geraldton may only add one Sister City per year;
- The proposed Candidate City must be with a country with which the Federal Government of Australia and/or Government of Western Australia has a positive relationship;
- In addition to formal Sister Cities, the City may also establish Strategic Partnerships as determined by Council.
- Proposals that conform to the selection criteria will be submitted for endorsement by Executive Management Team followed by a Council decision.

3. Selection Criteria

The following criteria should be utilised in the selection of Sister City or Strategic Partner City. Note that high rankings in some categories may negate lower rankings in other:

- People-to-people relationships: It is desirable that there be an existing economic, social or cultural link between the Candidate City and the City of Greater Geraldton to act as a foundation for building and sustaining the relationship;
- Gross Domestic Product: should be comparable to the Mid West region or larger or of an equivalent proportional GDP ratio of country to region;
- **Growth:** Candidate Cities should have favourable growth rates;
- Economic Activity: Candidate Cities should have strong trade activity;
- Potential: Candidate Cities should be identified as priorities for future development;
- **Investment:** Candidate Cities should have potential for mutual investment;
- **Commercialisation:** Candidate Cities should have potential for cooperation in commercially applicable research;
- Academic organisations: Candidate Cities should have academic institutions such as colleges, universities and research centres;
- Innovation: Candidate Cities should encourage new technologies, research and invention:
- **Tourism:** Candidate Cities should provide some opportunity to increase tourism activity; and
- Affiliations: Candidate Cities should have a Chamber of Commerce or other business or industry associations – or if equivalent bodies are not the custom in the country, some body through which the Mid West Chamber of Commerce and Industry may engage with business entities in that City or state/province.

Some lower socio-economic regions may not meet all of the above criteria, and the Council may take that into consideration for humanitarian, philanthropic or other reasons.

Depending on cultural conventions of the international community or city, an agreement forming an international relationship might variously be referred to as a Treaty of Friendship, or a Friendship Agreement. The nature of the relationship with a particular city will be determined by Council i.e. either a Sister City Relationship, or a Strategic Partnership.

The development of International relationships should be prioritised where multiple suitable candidates are identified for consideration. Candidates meeting the following criteria are likely to be prioritised for the establishment of a Sister City relationship or a Strategic Partnership:

 Cities that are at Prefecture Level or above, if the candidate city is in the People's Republic of China;

Cities that have a sea port and/or an airport which could facilitate trade and exchanges with the Mid West Port Authority and/or the Geraldton Airport.

4. Process to Establish a New International Relationship

Proposals are to be prepared by City of Greater Geraldton officers or, if framed by another party, analysed by City of Greater Geraldton officers, and a report prepared, for consideration of a proposal by

Council's Sister City Economic & Cultural Development Advisory Committee.

Assessment of proposals will be on the basis of the goals and objectives of the City of Greater Geraldton establishing International Relations, and the selection criteria, as set out in this policy.

If a proposed relationship is endorsed by the Advisory Committee, officers will prepare a report on the Committee endorsed relationship, seeking Council deliberation on the proposal. The report to Council will set out the anticipated costs to the City, and benefits, of entering into the proposed new relationship. Discretion rests exclusively with Council to approve or reject the proposal.

Selection Criteria

The following criteria should be utilised in the selection of Sister City or Strategic Partner City.

General Criteria:

- Gross Domestic Product: should be comparable to the Mid West region or larger or of an equivalent proportional GDP ratio of country to region;
- · Growth: Candidate Cities should have favorable growth rates;
- Economic Activity: Candidate Cities should have strong trade activity;
- Potential: Candidate Cities should be identified as priorities for future development;
- Investment: Candidate Cities should have potential for mutual investment:
- Commercialisation: Candidate Cities should have potential for cooperation in commercially applicable research;
- Academic organisations: Candidate Cities should have academic institutions such as colleges, universities and research centres;
- Innovation: Candidate Cities should encourage new technologies, research and invention.

- Support the City of Greater Geraldton's strategic priorities
- Expand the City's network of business contacts and relationships
- Increase international private sector investment in the Mid West
- Provide a conduit between local innovation and international industry
- Accelerate economic growth through commercial partnerships
- Leverage existing industry strengths into increased innovation and job creation
- Grow the Traded Sectors of the City's regional economy
- Promote the Mid West region as an attractive tourist destination
