SPP 3.7 requires that consideration of bushfire hazards should be undertaken for any strategic planning proposal. The policy measures within SPP 3.7 (such as the requirement for a BMP) are only required where the land has or will have a BHL or BAL rating above low applies. A BHL or BAL assessment should be conducted and this information should be included in the amendment report. The outcome of this assessment will determine if other policy measures are necessary, and they can then be conducted and included within the scheme amendment report to ensure that SPP 3.7 is appropriately addressed.
