EXECUTIVE SUMMARY – MID WEST PROCUREMENT OFFICER QUARTERLY REPORT

BACKGROUND

The Mid West Procurement Officer (MWPO) was appointed on the 18/1/2010 by the Mid West Chamber of Commerce and Industry as the Host agency. Funding for the position has been sourced from the following parties.

Q2 ACTIVITY

Attached is a report of activity to date against the KPI's (KPI's previously circulated to all stakeholders).

The **Industry data base** is continuing in its development and it has moved from 691 businesses across the Mid West in the last report to 806 at the end of September 2011. The actual number of registered businesses is closer to 600 as many companies have multiple entries listed. Currently there are 265 Industry Categories in the database. The number of Company Profiles registered is 147 and further followup work is progressing on increasing this number.

Best Practice Visits

Queensland National Freight participated in a visit on Friday 29 July in relation to their East Narngulu rail project. At their request I was able to organise visits and meetings with the following organisations. Carr Civil, Central Earthmoving, Diab, Maicon Engineering, Midwest Transportables and Fuel Fix Tanks 2 Go. Due to the shortness of their visit I took them on a whistlestop tour of Narngulu and Webberton LIA's pointing out the range of businesses that were available to work with them on this project.

The visits were well received and I believe have added value to the capability of our Geraldton based businesses.

The timeframe for this project is very tight with the earthworks tender closing on 5 August 2011.

The Mid West Economic Summit also presented the opportunity for networking and for delegates to visit local businesses.

I have been liaising with Stuart Griffiths from Sinosteel about work opportunities and I was able to take him to three businesses that he has been in contact with recently. These businesses were Adam's Catering, Masters of Maintenance and Midwest Transportables. The visit enabled Stuart to discuss first hand, some possible opportunities that may become available in his organisation over the next 6 months.

Dalwallinu

A visit to Dalwallinu businesses over two days culminated in a Business Network event on the evening of 10 August 2011.

The event was a JV between the MWCCI and the Dalwallinu Shire and was sponsored by Asia Iron Extension Hill Ltd. Harry Goff from Asia Iron delivered a presentation to 60 local business people on the current status of the project. The interaction from the participants was very good and Barbara Thompson was able to sign up several new members on the night.

The Procurement Data Base has added approximately 30 new businesses from this trip.

Another successful event was held this year with 320 participants over the two days of the summit. It was very pleasing to see several new companies on the the speakers list. I have made contact with Ferrowest, Sheffield Resources and Padbury Mining and I am hopeful that business opportunities will eventuate over the next 12 to 18 months.
