Located in the forecourt immediately to the east of the Mullewa Town Hall, the War Memorial comprises a simple granite obelisk mounted on a stepped square base. Plaques are affixed to the highest section of the base including one which reads: "Sacred to the memory of all who gave their lives that we may live in freedom. 1914-1918, 1939-1945. A flag pole stands to the eastern side, while the memorial is surrounded on three sides by garden beds. An artistic backdrop to the memorial is provided by a mural on the end wall of the Bowtell Building showing soldiers silhouetted against a sunset.

Although the official Mullewa Sub-Branch of the Returned Sailors and Soldiers' Imperial League of Australia was formed in 1922, it was not until 1929 that the organisation took real shape. In 1936, the Mullewa R.S.L. Memorial Hall was constructed. In 1958, the Mullewa Sub-Branch of the R.S.L. was responsible for the construction of the War Memorial to honour servicemen who lost their lives in armed conflicts. The memorial was officially unveiled by Mr W.S. Lonnie, State President of the R.S.L. (Sources: Barden, W.D.)

Located on the corner of Padbury and Mills Streets, but addressing the former, this timber framed building is clad with weatherboards. The corrugated iron dutch gable roof extends to cover the verandah to the front (south) elevation which is supported on timber posts. The roof also extends to cover a side verandah to the east elevation which is partly enclosed with fibro sheeting. The roofscape is punctuated by two red brick chimneys. Three doors address the Padbury Street elevation, possibly indicative of the building's former use as both a Police Station and Residence wherein separate entrances were required. There is a low metal pole and wire fence to the property boundary.

During 1912 tenders were called for a new Police Office and Residence for Mullewa, and shortly after this the building was constructed, including a gaol. This building was used as such until 1961 when the new Mullewa P{olice Station and Courthouse was opened nearby on Mills Street.

Statement of Significance:

The Old Police Station and Residence served the community of Mullewa in the provision of police services for 49 years and as such has historic and social significance. The weatherboard building is very intact and retains some of its original features, including the double set of french doors and corbelled brick chimney, and as such makes an important contribution to the historic built fabric of the town.

Prominently situated, these two adjoining shops are set back from Jose Street owing to the reorientation of the intersection with Gray Street which has resulted in a large paved area to the building frontage. The building is of rendered brick construction with a metal skillion roof. The shop fronts are dominated by large shop windows which have been boarded up. The southern shop, which comprised the newsagency, is the larger of the two, while the smaller shop front retains its original recessed entry. The original bullnosed verandah has been replaced by an unsympathetic flat awning, above which is a decorative stepped parapet. The building is painted in pastel colours (green, blue, purple and grey).

The two shops were built in the 1920s by well known local Mullewa identity Tom Haley, who operated a newsagency out of the larger store, as well as a barbers. The shop continued to operate as the town's newsagency until the mid 1990s. A drapery occupied the smaller store for many years.

Statement of Significance:

Tom Haley's Newsagency has historic value to the Mullewa community as a commercial premise which has operated in the town since the 1920s and is associated with a well known local identity. The place makes a positive contribution to the streetscape of Jose Street and, because of its prominent location, is an important part of the built fabric of Mullewa. Although the original verandah form has been altered, much of the decorative detailing remains to the front facade which gives the place aesthetic appeal.

This small single storey commerical premise is of rendered brick construction with a hipped zincalume roof hidden behind a low, simple parapet. The front façade addressing Jose Street has a side entry door and two windows, above which is a flat awning. The original timber framed windows have been replaced with aluminium framed alternatives, with metal grilles in front. The building is painted predominently cream with a Federation Red highlight colour.

Fronting directly onto the Jose Street footpath, this rendered brick building has a symmetrical façade which is divided evenly between two shop fronts, each with its own separate entry door. The large shop windows have been boarded up. The verandah has been removed, however evidence remains of its original height. The decorative parapet features separate turrets at each end, while behind the parapet is the gable corrugated iron roof which is punctuated by a plain brick chimney. The front facade is painted in shades of purple and green. Windows to the side elevation have mostly been replaced with aluminium frames.

Believed to have been built in the c1920s, the shops were bought by Sam Coniglio in the late 1930s. He established a greengrocers in the premises, which remained in the family for almost 60 years. Sam's wife took over the greengrocery business for a number of years, and then in the 1950s it passed on to Sam Pirrottina, who was married to one of the Coniglio daughters. The business was finally sold in the 1990s.

Coniglio's Greengrocers Fmr has considerable aesthetic appeal. The decorative parapet detailing combined with the highly original form of the building combine to make the place a valuable element of the streetscape. A box awning extends over the footpath with a stepped parapet above including a central triangular feature. A corrugated iron gable roof extends behind the parapet. The shop front is painted in pastel hues (blue, green and purple).

Fronting on to Jose Street, this combination shop and residence has been altered over time to accommodate different uses. The small shop front is on the south side of the building and consists of a rendered masonry front wall with an entrance door and a large shop window which features a shallow arch to the top edge. The original verandah roof has been replaced with a simple box awning supported on two verandah posts. There is a simple parapet rising to approximatley 2 metres above the awning. To the rear and side is the attached residence which has a corrugated iron hipped roof punctuated by a chimney to the northern roofscape. The original front verandah has been extended out to the footpath and enclosed with fibro sheeting and security shutters and generally detracts from the aesthetic appeal of the place. The building has been painted in pastel hues (purple and green).

Located opposite the Railway Station on the southern side of Maley Street is a small square piece of land surrounded by a tall metal pole and wire mesh perimeter fence. Inside is the overgrown grave of Sam Diddams. Consisting of a marble headstone and a metal grave surround, a clear view of the site was obscured by the fence and grasses covering the site.

In the first years of settlement the town of Mullewa did not have an official graveyard. Burials were carried out on the hill overlooking the railway station and it is estimated that approximately 50 graves are located in this area. During work associated with the railway extensions, many of the grave sites were unfortunately obliterated. However, one grave remains - that of Sam Diddams, the son of the local baker who died of typhoid fever on 22 January 1895, aged 25 years. In the years that followed a Cemetery Board was established and a new cemetery (the Pioneer Cemetery) was opened on the North Road, a couple of miles to the north of Mullewa. Then in the c1950s this original cemetery was found to be unsuitable for further interments and a new one was established along the road leading from Mullewa to Mingenew.

To the east of the Mullewa Townsite and the grain silos a rough gravel track leads to the north through bushland variously known as 'the common' or 'the Old Show Ground'. A low outcrop of natural rock rises above a gentle slope, with nearby gum trees and shrubs adding to the picturesque setting. Part of the rock ledge has been chiselled flat to serve as a table and altar. 

In the mid to late 1920s, Harold James 'Jim' Wright, the co-owner of the Pindar Garage and Stoner & Wright's Motor Engineers and Haulage Contractors, organized for local Pindar resident H. Jones to cart a dwelling from Yuin Reef to Pindar, where it was re-erected on the right side of the garage building, on the adjoining Lot 10, fronting Sharpe Street. The dwelling served as the Wrights' family home for around 40 years. On 22 August 1969, brothers and local farmers Ray and Allen Field purchased both the Garage and the residence. When the Fields sold their farm in 1990, the Pindar house ceased to be used as a permanent residence, but has been used periodically when the Fields visit Pindar.
