# **Mullewa Town Revitalisation**

Since August 2014, consultation with the Mullewa community has occurred regarding proposed projects to be included in a Mullewa 'Town Revitalisation Project'. The projects consulted (which are derived from the Capital Works Priority Listing), have been scored and ranked by the Mullewa community, per the below table. This attachment seeks to provide council with an overview of the qualitative comments that were received during this process, and will be used to help inform the development of these project business cases moving forward.

#### **COMMUNITY RANKING OF PROJECTS**

The building presently occupied by the Mullewa Women's Indigenous Group (MWIG) is presently owned by MEEDAC. Should the outcome of further consultation (as noted \*) indicate that the community's preference remains to retain the MWIG art studio, this will be investigated with MEEDAC.

# **NEW PROJECTS SUGGESTED BY THE COMMUNITY**

Project	Potential
Masonic Lodge	External & structural work has been completed on the Masonic Lodge in Mullewa, further work is required to restore the building internally.
CCTV (security cameras)	There is already 3 security cameras in the town centre, continue this project by providing more cameras in other areas around town
Safe-house	Provide a place for crisis accommodation, in the event of unforeseen incidents
