5	Patio Update The patio area has been completed and the individuals/groups who contributed to the refurbishment have been acknowledged in the QEII July newsletter.	
6	Seniors Recreation Council of WA Inc An information session was held by the Seniors Recreation of WA Inc at the centre on the 25 June with 26 seniors attending the presentation. A decision was made to establish a Geraldton branch. The committee was formed and will hold their first formal meeting on the 15 July.	

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7	Dementia Friendly City	
	The QEII Centre, WA Art Gallery and WA Museum in Geraldton have been chosen as pilot sites by Alzheimer's Australia to be assessed as Dementia Friendly.	
	A representative from the organisation will be visiting the QEII Centre on the 28 July to provide further information.	
8	Stay on Your Feet Grant Application	
	The City in collaboration with the Day Therapy Unit (Geraldton Regional Hospital) has submitted a grant application to commence a three month exercise program suitable for clients at risk of falls. It will be extension of the services provided by the Day Therapy Unit and will be conducted twice a week at the QEII Centre.	
	The proposal includes a bus to pick up/drop off clients to the centre and train peer volunteers in the "Otago Exercise Method" so the program can continue beyond the funding period.	
	Advice of the outcome of the grant application is expected by the end of July.	
9	Our Home, Our Streets, Spalding Project	
	The City of Greater Geraldton is partnering with stakeholders such as Police, Dept of Housing, Bundiyarra to present a concerted effort in the community by energising the residents to come together to make a difference in their neighbourhood.	
	A Hip Hop, Art and a senior's outreach program starting in the week on 22 July are initial ten week pilot programs aimed at bringing residents together.	
	Louise, O'Malley (QEII relief staff) will be facilitating the ten week seniors program which will include craft, games days etc. The goal is for seniors in the Spalding area to take ownership of program to become sustainable after the pilot period.	
10.	Tax Help Program	
	A tax help volunteer trained by the Australia Taxation Department will be available for free tax help from the 27 July until the 31 October at the QEII Centre. The service is available for seniors and low income earners who meet eligibility criteria.	-
