SUMMARY:

DATE OF REPORT:

The purpose of this report is to update the Committee on the visit to Townsville Enterprise Ltd and to advise on its structure and operation.

PROPONENT:

The proponent is the City of Greater Geraldton.

BACKGROUND:

As Committee members will recall that the terms of reference for the Geraldton Futures Alliance Committee include the investigation of other structures for economic development such as the Townsville model.

As a consequence, on the 25 July 2013 the Director Organisational Performance and the Director Creative Communities met with the Chief Executive Officer of Townsville Enterprise Ltd (TEL) to discuss its structure and activities in the Townsville region.

1. What is Townsville Enterprise Ltd

Townsville Enterprise Ltd is a not for profit organisation which has three core business areas - regional economic development, tourism and events and convention bureau. It has been in existence for 21 years.

Economic Development – TEL is the Regional Economic Development Organisation for North Queensland. It works with all levels of government, government departments and the private sector to identify core areas for the sustainable economic development of the Region.

Tourism and Events - TEL is the Regional Tourism Organisation (RTO) for the Townsville North Queensland Region and works with the tourism industry and government/industry agencies such as Tourism & Events Queensland, Queensland Tourism Industry Council, Tourism Australia and the State and Federal Governments to position the Townsville Region as a diverse and exciting holiday destination.

Convention Bureau - The Convention Bureau markets the Townsville Region as a leading business events destination and campaigns to keep delegates in the Region for pre and post event touring.

2. How is it funded

TEL receives 20% of its funding from local government. It has a service agreement with Townsville City Council, Palm Island, Hinchinbrook, Burdekin, and Charters Towers. It receives 15% of its funding from Federal and State governments however this is mainly for tourism. The final 65% comes from memberships and sponsorships. Total income for membership and sponsorships for 2011/12 was \$2M.

3. What does it do

TEL is involved in a lot of regional projects for economic development and tourism and events and produces high quality documents to support these activities. It is a regional tourist organisation under Queensland Tourism and manages the Visitor Information Centre. In recognising that Townsville is not a tourist destination TEL concentrates on the events market in order to generate visitors. An example of this is the V8 Supercars. TEL has a staff of 20.

Further to this, it runs the Indigenous Engagement Project for creating employment for indigenous secondary and tertiary graduates and also the Emerging Leaders Program.

Relevance to Geraldton.

The not for profit model of TEL could be applied to this area in the establishment of an independent organisation to manage economic development and tourism and events for the mid-west region. The Townsville model is being adopted by Geelong and is used by a number of regional economic development and tourism organisations in Queensland.

4. THE MID WEST ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BLUEPRINT

Gavin Treasure gave an update on the Mid West Economic Development Blueprint, which outlines key strategies and implementation plans for the socio-economic development in the Midwest region. To be termed as the Mid West Investment Plan Mark II, this strategic document will be reviewed on a 4-yearly basis in order to ensure its robust reflection of the region's social, economic and infrastructure development landscape from 2014 to 2025.

The strategic document is jointly developed by the Regional Development Australia Midwest Gascoyne (RDA-MWG) and the Midwest Development Commission (MWDC), a strategic collaboration initiative between a State and a Federal government agency, and in consultation with the key stakeholders and local community within the four Midwest sub regions namely:

- i. Murchison:
- ii. Batavia Coast;
- iii. North Midlands; and
- iv. Gascoyne.

The main development themes being identified in this strategic document include, but not limited to:

- i. Infrastructure Development;
- ii. Small Businesses' Capacity and Competitiveness;
- iii. Regional Tourism Development;
- iv. Education and Healthcare (particularly for the younger age group);
- v. Housing Provisioning.

There are three main stages in developing this strategic document:

- i. The Stakeholders Engagement Stage consultations with regional 'leaders', agencies, local governments, community, businesses and industry are currently underway and will be concluded with an organisation of the 'Thought Leader Forum' in October 2013;
- ii. The Context, Analysis, Strategies & Actions Planning Stage key determinants for the regional growth and development will be analysed and the main development strategies and actions will be established by the end of 2013;
- iii. The Output Finalisation Stage this strategic document is expected to be finalised and published by the first half of the year 2014.
