

Art teacher Jim Evans, a volunteer, said it was a huge achievement to have held the classes for a decade.

"If I am still able I will continue for another 10 years," he said. "I love art. I have a passion for art and it is great to see this class go ahead for so long." Mr Évans said his goals for the group included exhibiting
