Greenough BFAC 21/03/2025

CBFCO report

- #61 incidents attended in total for CGG.
- # One major incident being the Minninooka fire with good support from all the CGG brigades. Other than that, a quiet harvest.
- # Purchasing a collar tank.
- # Eradu truck is now based at Greens property at Eradu with 10 local FF able to crew the appliance.
- #CGG brigades supported the Irwin fire in December with crews attending on the 28th and 29th.
- # Now open burning in the broadacre areas. Please monitor conditions prior to burning.
- # Approval has been given by DFES to use the channel 194 to contact Com Cen on brigade turn out and arrival. This can be used by the 3 city-based brigades. The city will send out some instructions in the future.
- # The city was successful in gaining some MAF (mitigation activity funding) and have been able to complete 4 prescriptions 1 at mullewa and 3 around Geraldton. Total value \$31000.
- # The city is proposing to hold a get together for brigade members and families in late August or September. It may take the form of social bowls followed by dinner.
- # The city now has access to an app called Fire Mapper. The app will be available on mobile phones and available to brigades. It will be used by FCOs and brigade and crew leaders.

We will send out use instructions to brigade leaders soon.
