RE-FOCUSED and Batavia Unravelled

RE-FOCUSED a Geraldton Camera Club Exhibition

This exhibition celebrated the nationally-accredited award-winning photography from the Geraldton Camera Club. This exhibition features winners from the past three years of the Clubs' annual display. Featuring a range of different award categories and themes, the photography skills of the local Mid West photographers were put on show.

Batavia Unravelled an Exhibition developed and curated by Emma-Clare Bussell

Finding new expression through craft and the stories of women, this exhibition presented works from WA Collections, the CGG Art Collection and new responses to this historical milestone by contemporary WA artists. This was a Curated Group Exhibition led by Emma-Clare Bussell, featuring works from artists such as Susie Vickery, Melinda Piesse, Bradley Kickett, Georgia Zoric, Rob Cleworth, Eduardo Cossio, Ailsa Small, Patrick Baker, Hugh Edwards, Henrietta Drake-Brockman and others.

Art in Conflict an Australian War Memorial Touring Exhibition

Art in Conflict is a touring exhibition of contemporary art from the collection of the Australian War Memorial. The exhibition is touring nationally until 2026, before its display in the Australian War Memorial's new galleries.

A showcase of diverse responses to war, the exhibition includes more than 70 paintings, drawings, films, prints, photography and sculptures from leading Australian artists.

Stitched and bound 2024/25 the WAQA Contemporary Exhibition

stitched and bound is The West Australian Quilters Association Inc. (WAQA) Contemporary Exhibition. It is a biennial, juried exhibition showcasing the innovative range of work being produced by Western Australian artists who challenge the usual concept of the 'quilt' medium.

Through a two-stage selection process, the following design by local artist, Cam Fitzgerald was selected in response to the Artist Brief. Thank you to GRAAC members, Annalise Fosbury and Alysha Saunders for assisting with stage two of the evaluation. The final will be printed onto vinyl and attached to the wall via aluminium sheets.



• PA 214 - Wonthella Ablution Block Bugs Project (Completed)

Kelli & Briony facilitated two hands-on art workshops for the year 4's and 5's at St. Johns School, exploring mark-making, pattern techniques, collage, watercolour and acrylic applications. The student's work was digitised and printed onto vinyl / aluminium to create this colourful bug collage which wraps around the toilet block at the Eighth Street sporting precinct. We hosted an opening event with the children, media and the Mayor attending.







Public Art Maintenance (Completed)

PA 173 - Alf Crothers Memorial Wishing Well: the wishing well structure was renewed, with new railings around the well, and the metal structure above the well was re-painted.

PA 176 - Mullewa ANZAC Memorial: Two additional photographic images were installed on the large brick wall in Mullewa, in time for ANZAC Day 2025. New garden sign installed allowing the public to understand the important story behind the photographic exhibition.





PA 180 – Everlasting Impression Mullewa: XW Engineering contractors have completed requested rust removal works.





Public Art Maintenance (Upcoming)

PA 001 – City Status Fountain Sculpture:

For safety and practicality reasons, the old fountain and pumping station will be decommissioned, both of which have taken a lot of resources over the years to maintain. Step 1: XW Engineering to remove metal section and re-create the same structure but in a safer design that doesn't collect rubbish.

Step 2: The water well will be infilled with cracker dust, compact and ready for the install of the soft fall rubber. The pebble surface around the sculpture will also be prepped and soft fall rubber installed.

Step 3: New metal feature installed.

Predicted timeline: aim to have works completed by November.
