5.2. The Selection of the Proponent for Option 3A

The following discussion and recommendation is to action Council Resolution IS194 – HMAS Sydney II Memorial Public Facilities, resolved on 23 April 2019, and recorded as follows:

<u>PART C</u>

- 4. **PROVIDE** in principle support for the Smith Sculptors Concept Design 3A" for the Visitor Guide Facility and Wall of Attributes.
- 5. SUPPORT the HMAS Sydney II Memorial Committee to SEEK external grant funding contributions towards the construction of the preferred option 3A;

The Committee discussed possible alternate proponents but all agreed that based on the historic involvement with the existing Memorial construction, that the Geraldton Rotary Club were the preferred proponent. The Committee was advised by the representatives of the Rotary Club that the Geraldton Rotary Club were supportive of being nominated as the proponent.

Committee Recommendation

This Committee endorses that the Rotary Club of Geraldton becomes the proponent of Option 3A.

Dear Don






