1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

The Chair welcomed the members and apologies were noted as above.

2. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

3.2. From Chief Bush Fire Control Officer - Murray Smith

Appliances

- 1. Equipment inspections have occurred including pressure testing of all hoses, fire extinguishers, fire blankets, medical oxygen, defibrillators, radios and all on-board equipment. A stock take has been done of all these items.
- Pre-season vehicle inspections (VPOWER) will occur in the coming two weeks, appliances will remain on-station for this process, these checks will be completed by CGG Fleet mechanics.
- 3. Two bids will (again) be made to the Local Government Grant Scheme for additional appliances. These are:
 - (a) A Light Tanker for the Cape Burney brigade, and
 - (b) A Bulk Water Tanker as regional resource located at either the CGG Depot or the Moonyoonooka brigade.

Query raised regarding the City's use of bulk water carriers in fire/emergency situations. Brendan Wilson advised the City's preference is to utilise contractors in the first instance for the first 24 hours.

Further query raised as to whether it should be documented that locally available contractors should be used in Mullewa and outer regions, rather than wait for a response from Geraldton. Brendan Wilson to clarify

4. GENERAL BUSINESS

4.1. City Capital Works Program

4.1.1 Weather Stations

A grant-funded project to provide five (5) weather stations across the City of Greater Geraldton has been approved. The most appropriate locations for each station are currently being determined.

The stations are proposed to be either co-located with existing secured buildings, or contained within a secure enclosure if not co-located with a building.

ACTION:

Brendan Wilson to create a map and send to Committee members, for them to recommend sites.

4.1.2 Eradu Bush Fire Brigade Facility

Planning and design of a BFB facility at Eradu has been approved in the budget for this financial year. Suitable locations will be identified, followed by design and costings. The City will then submit a request to DFES to have a facility constructed utilising ESL funding.

4.2. Standpipes and Water Storage

Revised mapping of standpipes and water storage tanks is completed. See attached maps. No further tanks are currently planned, subject to the provision of a Bulk Water Tanker.

4.3. Fire Danger Rating Signs (FDR)

The City's Governance Team have identified Fire Danger Rating Signs as a risk for the City. Subject to feedback from the Mullewa and Greenough BFACs, the City intends to submit a capital nomination for installation of (three to four) electronic Fire Danger Rating Signs.

Funding may be available via AWARE grant funding program or Smart Cities Funding.

4.4. Contractor Machinery Logs

Contractor Machinery Log books were distributed to each FCO for use when engaging contractors during or emergencies. This system will allow greater financial management and accountability for City officers.

4.5. Personal Protective Equipment Audit

FCOs present were reminded to record each brigades' distribution of PPE to allow for logging by the City.

4.6. Restricted and Prohibited Burning Times

All were happy with the proposed dates, no amendments to occur.

4.7. Presentation by Matt Dad, DFES

Matt Dadd spoke about his role at DFES. He holds the permanent role of Bush Fire Risk Management Officer for the Midwest-Gascoyne region. Explained his portfolio responsibilities and gave background on his previous experience.

Matt advised that the first mitigation burning in the region would be a Wiluna on 30 September 2018.

4.8. Other General Business

Sam Messina raised the need for a prescribed burn along the rail corridor within the Mullewa town site. Noted that Brookfield Rail create issues however, this creates stress for the town's residents and businesses. Due to the anti-social behaviour amongst the town's youth creates the likelihood of a fire in the rail corridor.

Brett Steele raised issue regarding storage of ESL fire trucks on private land as per last minutes. Majority felt that having the vehicles in unmanned sheds on public land or local government land would lead to vandalism etc whereas storage on private property would be more secure.
